2 CONFIRMATION OF CHAIR

#### 6 TERMS OF REFERENCE OF LOCAL PENSION BOARD

6.1 The terms of reference were presented for consideration.

6.2 **RESOLVED to agree the terms of reference.**

#### 7 TRAINING

7.1 ACFO MacArthur delivered an induction training session on the work of the Local Pension Board. It was noted that one of the requirements of the Pensions Regulator is that all members received appropriate training and has sufficient knowledge of the Schemes. The training covered the following areas:

- the Legal Framework
- the Firefighters' Pension Scheme(s)
- the financial aspects
- scheme regulation
- addressing concerns informally where possible; alternatively the formal process known as the internal dispute resolution procedure (IDRP) will be followed.

7.2 **RESOLVED to note the information provided and thank ACFO MacArthur for the informative presentation.**

## 8 FORWARD WORK PLAN

8.1 The forward work plan was presented to Members to provide an overview of the work for the Board for the financial year 2022/23.

8.2 It was agreed that an element of training would be on the agenda for every meeting and that a training needs analysis will be undertaken at the next meeting.

## 9 FIREFIGHTERS' PENSION SCHEMES – UPDATE REPORT

9.1 The Pensions Officer presented the report which provided an update on current issues relating to the Firefighters' Pension Schemes as follows:

- with effect from 1 April 2022 all active members and future members are/will be in the 2015 Pension Scheme. Prior to April 2022, there were four different pension schemes;
- an auto-enrolment exercise will be undertaken in October 2022 in accordance with the Pensions Act 2008 which states that every three years, those individuals who have opted out of the pension scheme need to be opted back in, and a re-declaration of compliance is required showing evidence of this exercise;
- the Government Actuary's Department has been commissioned to undertake the four yearly valuation of the firefighters pension schemes. This framework of valuations allows for greater transparency in the risk sharing between members and taxpayers;
- a pensions dashboard is being introduced to help individuals, who may have numerous pension policies, to see all their pensions information in one place. This is a national project and the Service is currently in the phase scheduled for April 2024.

## 10 DYFED PENSION FUND UPDATE (SCHEME ADMINISTRATOR)

10.1 ACFO Macarthur presented the Dyfed Pension Fund report which provided information on the following areas:

- Regulatory Update
- E-communication
- GMP reconciliation
- My Pensions Online
- Workflow.

10.2 The importance of the pension scheme members checking their My Pensions Online account was again highlighted as this is the quickest and easiest way of identifying any issues. It was noted that representative bodies need to keep communicating and promoting this to their members.

10.3 **RESOLVED to note the information provided.**

11 UPDATE ON LEGAL MATTERS

11.1 ACFO MacArthur presented the report which gave an update on legal matters affecting the firefighters pension scheme.

11.2 It was noted that there are two national legal challenges which will impact on the Firefighters Pension Schemes; the McCloud judgment and the O'Brien judgment. Updates on these will be provided to members at every meeting.

11.3 In terms of the McCloud/Sargeant judgment, it was noted that this is a case around a challenge based on age discrimination and is applicable to all public sector schemes. The UK Government is currently working through the legislative processes and it is anticipated that this will be completed by around October 2023. However, for members who are due to retire prior to that date they are considered to be at 'immediate detriment'. In the Service, there are approximately 10 individuals who are potentially coming up to retirement and will be affected by this matter; they are being supported by the Service. It was also noted that the Scheme administrators will provide these individuals with calculations including tax implications. It was, however, highlighted that these calculations take up a lot of time and therefore scheme members who are not nearing retirement are asked to use the online calculator rather than contact the scheme administrators.

11.4 It was noted that the O'Brien judgment has been accepted as being applicable to personnel on the retained duty system. It was confirmed that the Scheme Advisory Board for Wales will take this forward together with the Welsh Government and no further action is required by the Authority at this time.

11.5 **RESOLVED to note the ongoing legal matters relevant to the firefighters pension scheme.**

12 MANAGEMENT OF RISKS

12.1 The report was presented to provide an update on the risk management arrangements.

- 12.2 It was noted that the effective management of the firefighter pension schemes is underpinned by risk management arrangements. These arrangements include the identification, evaluation, management and reporting of risks that are relevant to achieving the scheme objectives. The Authority's classification of risks falls into four headings:
- Operations
  - Financial
  - Funding
  - Compliance.

**RESOLVED to**

- (i) note the approach to risk management for the firefighter pension schemes;**
- (ii) agree that the risk register is included on each agenda of the Local Pension Board and all risks are reviewed on a cyclical basis.**

13 MATTERS TO BE REFERRED TO THE FRA

- 13.1 It was agreed that no issues needed to be referred to the FRA.

14 ANY OTHER BUSINESS

- 14.1 My Pensions Online – union representatives asked to encourage all of the members to access My Pensions Online.

- 14.2 Pension training for on-call/RDS personnel - It had been identified that members of staff working the on-call/retained duty system would benefit from receiving training on pensions and therefore training sessions will be held for all on-call members of staff. If required, similar sessions could be held for wholetime duty system members of staff as well.
